- Legalisation of the same-sex marriage, a long battle in Taiwan which has lasted for more than 35 years and still ongoing....
- Marriage Equality Movement started in 1986 with a man called CHI Chiawei (祁家威) whose application for civil marriage with his partner was dismissed by Taipei District Court.



- Lobbying legislators:
 Draft bill regarding "Marriage
 Equality" presented by NGO in 2012

Petitioners joined by Ministry of Internal Affairs and Taipei City Government.

- 15 judges
- Open court hearing and debate on 2017/03/24. Live streaming online, the first time in Taiwan's history for a case pending at constitutional court

(1) The Civil Code prohibited two persons of the same sex to create a permanent union of intimate and exclusive nature for the committed purpose of managing a life together. To the extent of such failure, the provisions regarding marriage in Civil Code are in violation of both the people's freedom of marriage as protected by Article 22 and the people's right to equality as guaranteed by Article 7 of the Constitution

(2) The authorities concerned shall amend or enact relevant laws, in accordance with the ruling of this Interpretation, within two years from the issuance of this Interpretation. It is within the discretion of the authorities concerned to determine the formality for achieving the equal protection of the freedom of marriage.

(3) If relevant laws are not amended or enacted within the said two years, two persons of the same sex who intend to create the said permanent union shall be allowed to have their marriage registration effectuated at the authorities in charge of household registration, by submitting a written document signed by two or more witnesses in accordance with the Marriage Chapter of Civil Code.

From the Interpretation No. 748 to the law change....

- Big debate on the "formality" of the law: Union yes, but marriage? True equality?
- → The result of Referendum on 2018/11
- 1. Marriage is the union between "A MAN AND A WOMAN"
- 2. Legislator shall protect the rights to for an union of same-sex couple by presenting a specific bill rather than amending Civil Code

From the Interpretation No. 748 to the law change....

• Union or Marriage yes, but adoption and assisted reproduction?

Constitutional court did not mention if the same-sex couple would have the rights to do so.

- Open debate and vote article by article at the parliament on 2019.05.17.
- Live Streaming online.
- Huge crowd gathering organized by LGBT Rights NGOs in front Parliament.

- Marriage registration.
- "Almost" the same rights and obligation as straight couples stipulated in Civil Code, except...
- Some stipulations even more avant-garde compared to Marriage in Civil Code:
- (1) No-fault divorce (2) No in-law relationships one person and his/her spouse's family
